

Biosphere Stewardship Program Bali Barat National Park Bali, Indonesia June 17 - June 27, 2014

Program

Biosphere Foundation (BF) invites high school students aged 15-17 to join their Balinese counterparts for an environmental stewardship program set in beautiful Bali Barat National Park (BBNP), located on the northwest coast of the island. The park is a treasure with an abundance of wildlife and contains a rare combination of earth's ecosystems: a coral reef, rainforest, monsoon forest,



mangrove forest and savannah.



During this ten-day program, students will have the opportunity to participate in a unique approach to learning about our biosphere and how to care for it. They will experience the beauty of nature, study the park's ecosystems and discover their interconnectedness and interdependence. Students will also learn about critical challenges to

these ecosystems such as climate change, explore sustainable solutions and join together for a series of service projects in stewardship of the park's environment.

Students will be encouraged to build awareness about the need to preserve coral reefs and all the ecosystems of the national park and to take action for their protection. These efforts will be viewed in a global context and students will be offered tools for becoming stewardship leaders as well as concrete ways they can make a difference upon their return home through activities such as blogging, presentations and environmental stewardship projects in their local communities.





Students will engage in team-building exercises and outdoor activities such as hiking, swimming, snorkeling and boating. They will also have the chance to build bridges of cross-cultural communication and understanding and to experience Balinese

traditions such as ceremonies, dance

and Gamelan music.

Background

In 2008 BF began working in collaboration with BBNP, NGO's and the local community to protect the coral reefs around Menjangan Island, which are suffering increasingly from

dynamite fishing, anchor damage and climate change.





In 2011, BF and Yayasan Dwi Asih Sejahtera (a local charity partnered with the Jakarta-based Balinese Sustainable Management Group), co-founded Friends of community-based Meniangan (FOM), а dedicated to the care and protection of Menjangan Island's coral reefs. Since then, BF has worked with FOM to carry out environmental education/outreach programs and events over a thousand local students and NW stakeholders and establish community conservation

projects to preserve the biodiversity of BBNP and the surrounding NW Bali bioregion. In 2012, BF established an annual Biosphere Stewardship Program in BBNP for students from around the world, creating a demonstration of international cooperation for the benefit of earth's environment. Our local educational partner is Yayasan Anak Pemuteran, who prepares and sends Balinese students to participate in the program.



Details



Students will stay in a dormitory style field station in Bali Barat National Park. The fee for the land portion of the program including meals, accommodations and airport transfers to the national park is \$2,125 USD, exclusive of airfare. Students are required to obtain international travel/medical insurance and should arrange to arrive at Denpasar International Airport on June 17th and depart on June 27th.
